


Animal Helpers

Firefighter Dogs

- These dogs help let us know where a fire began
- They are specifically trained to help prevent future fires
- After a fire, they use their strong sense of smell to trace back to the origin of the fire





Use Your Nose!

Materials	Directions
 Small Containers Tin Foil Strong Scented Items Cinnamon Lemon Coffee Lavender Vanilla 	 Place one scent in each container Cover with tin foil and poke a few holes in the foil Encourage your little one to smell what is inside the containers Discuss how they are using their nose just like the Fire Dogs! For older children have them guess what they are smelling inside the containers

- Horses are great Animal Helpers!
- These are Stagecoach Horses.
- Their job was to help deliver the mail.
- They worked in teams to pull the stagecoach long distances between towns.


Horse Ride!
